Remember

If you have a cast in place the airline may ask you to present a medical certificate prior to flying. Check with you travel agent or airline prior to traveling.

Before you go

Arms and legs that have recently been broken have a high risk of swelling, this risk is increased if you fly. A solid cast will not allow the swelling to occur naturally and as a result serious problems may occur. By "splitting" the cast it will ensure that if this happens then no serious complications will arise.

Travelling is not advised for 48hours following application of the cast. However if you do need to fly then the cast will need to be "split".

"Splitting" the cast involves cutting down both sides of the cast to allow for possible swelling while flying. It is then lightly bound with a self adhesive tape. This will suffice until you return home.

Its advisable to check with your airline before you fly as some airlines will have different restrictions in place.





When you return

You will need to return to the hospital on your return to have a new cast fitted.

Please ensure that you make an appointment prior to leaving on your holidays.

Intending to swim



Casts must be kept dry but please ask your nurse about devices that you can get to cover the cast so your child can swim.

However with some breaks or after surgery, the orthopaedic surgeon may restrict certain activites.

Please ask to speak to the plaster nurse.
